John 15:9-17

Transition Scripture

John 15:9-17 - ⁹ "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. ¹⁰ If you keep my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commands and remain in his love. ¹¹ I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete. ¹² My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. ¹³ Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends. ¹⁴ You are my friends if you do what I command. ¹⁵ I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you. ¹⁶ You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last—and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you. ¹⁷ This is my command: Love each other.

- Insecure people have insecure connections.
- We believe people can have secure relationships when they are connected to Jesus.
- Big Idea: If you are connected to Jesus, you are secured by his love so you can love.
- The Love Model: ⁹ As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love
- Matthew 28:20b Surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age
- The Obedience Lock: ¹⁰ If you keep my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commands and remain in his love
- The Joy of Security: ¹¹ I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete.
- Joy is deep-seated sense of well-being, of safety in God's universe. Dallas Willard.
- If you are secured by his love, you will love.
- The Outflow truth: 12 My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you.
- Love gives.
- Adopt the Jesus standard for love.
- The Laydown Principle: ¹³ Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends.
- The Slave Friend Conversion: ¹⁴ You are my friends if you do what I command. ¹⁵ I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you.
- The Security of Being Chosen ¹⁶ You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last—and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you.
- The Reminder: ¹⁷ This is my command: Love each other.
- Are you secured by Jesus' love so you can love?
